## National University

- National Universities are reconstructed at April 2004.
- To enter the university, the Center Examination is required.
- Wide variety of curriculum rather than private schools.
- University Fees(Tuition fee/per year):
- Undergraduate students: 535,800 yen
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- Number of stuff: 2568
(President, Professor, Associate Pro., Technical Staff, etc. including)
- Number student:

Undergraduate 11,359 Graduate 3,671

## Degrees Awarded:

- Master (Arts, Education, Econommics, Science, Engineering, etc) in Total 15041 as of March 3, 2006, (980 in Year 2005).
- Doctor (Arts, Education, Econommics, Science, Engineering, etc) in Total 2,590 Old system until June 1991,

- (1) Basic Mathematical Education in University and the continuation from the studies in the High School.
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In FY2004, the Central Council for Education submitted three reports, concerning University Entrance Qualification Tests, pre-school education, and higher education respectively, and currently it is conducting vigorous deliberations concerning a variety of topics. In addition, in February 2005 the Compulsory Education Special Working Group established under the general committee began intensive deliberations on the ideal form of compulsory education overall and it plans to produce its conclusions by autumn 2005 MEXT is endeavoring to promote educational reform taking into account the reports submitted by the Central Council for Education.
